On the Wissahickon. Mount St. Joseph's College, Reading Pike and Wissahickon Drive. In 1858 Mother St. John founded this convent and moved Mount St. Joseph Academy Here from McSherrytown, Penna.
On the Wissahickon. Home of Robert Carson.

On The Wissahickon. Where the Wissahickon Drive Passes over the Creek at "Compton," John T. Morris Estate.

On the Wissahickon. Flour mill of Silas and John Clearver on W. Valley Green Road near Stenton ave.
On the Wissahickon. Pipers Grist Mill adjoining the White Marsh Country Club. The last mill to be operated on the Wissahickon Creek. Now owned by a Mr. Miller of Chestnut Hill.
On Paper Mill Run or Monoshone Cree. Large quarry, now used as an ash dump.
On the Wissahickon Creek. Lover's Leap, West bank of the creek above Hermit's Lane, Crowned by a summer house.
Mouth of the Wissahickon Creek as seen from the West bank of the Schuylkill...
Bridge carrying Ridge Road over the Wissahickon Creek photograph, 1912
The Roberson Mansion as it looked before alteration into a road house. Ridge Ave & Wissahickon Drive.
Rittenhouse's Fourth Paper Mill. Built 1780.
On Cresheim Creek. Dam and spillway of Lake Surprise.
On Cresheim Creek. Entrance to Cresheim Valley Drive at Germantown Ave.
On Cresheim Creek. Hill's Upper Mills. These stood on Cresheim Creek just below where McCallum Street Bridge now crosses the ravine through which the creek flows.
On the Wissahickon Creek. Old wooden bridge carrying Spruce Mill Road over the creek. Last of the Wooden Bridges.
Marble Statue of William Penn on Wissahickon Creek, "Toleration."
Ruins of the Gorgas Wadding Mills on Oil Creek Run
Kitchens Mills Wissahickon Creek and Kitchen's Lane
Lotus Inn at Wissahickon Drive and Shurs Lane photograph, 1911
On Paper Mill Run, showing where the run entered the lake at Chestnut Hill Park, also building in which were phonographs, moving pictures, etc. Building torn down in 1912.
On the Sandy Run (Depicts a summer house).

Remains of Old Spring House Probably Used by Dewees.
On the Wissahickon Creek. Dam on the W.C. in rear of Mt. St. Joseph's College. Possibly the remains of the Dewees Paper Mill Dam, The second paper mill in this country.
Glen Echo Carpet Mills, Carpenter St. where Lincoln Drive (now) is.
Rev. Dr. Roodney's House, East Corner Germantown Road & W. Duval St.
Johnson House, west corner Germantown Road and West Washington Lane.
John Bardsley's House, west corner Germantown Road and Upsal St.
A. Liebert House, now part of Lutheran Home, no. 6926 Germantown Road, opposite Gorgas Lane
